On the first Sunday in January end the Twelve Days of Christmas and families reunite to celebrate the coming of the Epiphany. During these reunions, a cake which contains a bean is shared among all present. The person who discovers the bean is crowned «king» or «queen» and must offer a cake in return in the days that follow. This would continue until the end of January.

In the Twelfth Night Cake (Pithiviers) available at Boutiques Au Pain Doré stores, our pastry bakers have hidden one porcelain figurine in each cake every year **. These figurines represent a popular theme that varies from one year to another.
